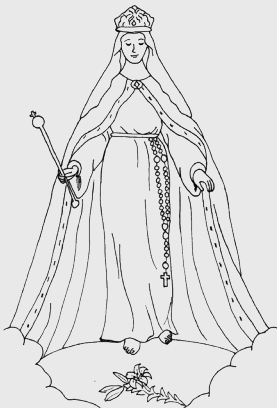

May: The Seven Joys of Mary – The Visit of the Magi – Reflection by Monique Sammut

"It is not the weight / Of jewel or plate, / Or the fondle of silk or fur; / 'Tis the spirit in which / The gift is rich / As the gifts of the Wise Ones were; / And we are not told / Whose gift was gold / And whose was the gift of myrrh." ~ Edmund Vance Cooke

Does anyone else start Christmas planning (and maybe Christmas shopping) right around mid-January? I do this not just because I'm a bit of a control freak, but because this gives me plenty of time to think, plan, and work on projects without cramming or stressing during November, December, and Advent. Why all this talk about gifts? Who doesn't call presents to mind when thinking about the Magi? It's even the first verse in the "We Three Kings" song: "*We three kings of Orient are bearing gifts....*" Gifts are a great way to show those we love and those around us that we care about them or are thinking about them.

The Magi might have given the first Christmas presents, but they wouldn't have been able to do this if God hadn't given us the greatest gift of all: His Son. In a Christmas Eve Homily a few years ago, Father mentioned how Bette Midler sings, "*God is watching us from a distance.*" He then went on to say (I can't remember his exact words, but this is the general idea) that the manger was proof that this isn't true. God isn't watching us from a distance. The refrain of a song by Downhere says, "*How many kings step down from their thrones? How many lords have abandoned their homes? How many greats have become the least for me? And how many gods have poured out their hearts to romance a world that is torn all apart? How many fathers gave up their sons for me? Only one did that for me.*" He came down to earth to be Emmanuel: God WITH us.

During this month of May, even though most of you reading this aren't thinking about Christmas presents just yet, let us stop and thank God for the gift of His Son, and although God can never be outdone in generosity, let us always remember He desires the gift of our hearts in return "*And to give our hearts to God daily is the greatest gift we may give Him*" (Pastor Jim Sole).

Nine Pro-Lifers Facing 11 Years in Prison – Please Write to the Judge!

Please write to Judge Colleen Kollar-Kotelly on behalf of nine pro-lifers who participated in a traditional rescue on 10/20/2020 at the Washington Surgi-Clinic, a late-term abortion clinic in Washington DC. They were charged with violating the 1994 Freedom of Access to Clinic Entrances Act (FACE), but they were additionally & unexpectedly charged with “conspiracy to interfere with civil rights” which carries a maximum 10 year sentence & a \$350,000 fine! This charge against pro-lifers is unprecedented in the history of the pro-life movement!

Four of the pro-lifers will be sentenced May 14, the next three on May 15, & the last two on May 17. The letters must be received by May 13! Beg her to be lenient, & emphasize that 8 of the pro-lifers, Heather Idoni, “Herb” Geraghty, Jean Marshall, Will Goodman, John Hinshaw, Joan Andrews Bell, Lauren Handy, & Jonathan Darnel, have been sitting in prison since their 2023 convictions, which is already longer than many others who have been convicted for similar “protest” sit-in type activity. Paulette Harlow is on house arrest due to severe health issues. Ask for “time served.” Emphasize that these are truly good, selfless people, who acted to defend life & were motivated by love for others! They acted to help the mothers coming to the abortion center & to defend the innocent unborn who are killed there though the 9th month of pregnancy!
