Taking Our Jitters to Jesus

Not too long ago, I was so excited about an upcoming event that anxious nervousness took over and I couldn't really focus or sit still. Eventually, not knowing what else to do, I told some friends I was going to go and wait out the jitters with Jesus. They told me I was on to something, so I thought about it some more.


We all have anxieties, fears, worries, and stress. No one is immune to suffering. But what do we do with our problems when they arise? Do we try to handle them all on our own? Do we white-knuckle it? Power through it? Do we fake it 'til we make it? Do we bury, numb, hide, shut down, or run? OR...do we take our jitters to Jesus?


It might be tempting to hide our troubles from Him. We might think they're stupid or that we can figure everything out on our own or that we're beyond help or we're somehow too much or too messy for Him to handle. But this is never the case. Jesus wants to hear about the good days, the amazing times, the smiles, the laughs, and the butterflies; but He also wants us to run to Him when we're so excited we're nervous, when we're sick with anxiety, when our stomach is tied up in knots, when the sleepless nights are weighing us down, or when the tears won't stop flowing. Jesus is there through it all – the bright days and the dark nights. He is the only one who can truly calm our hearts and souls and make everything that's upside down right side up again.

Lately, we have been hearing a great deal about Eucharistic revival. The great feast of Corpus Christi just passed, and we're in the middle of the month dedicated to the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus. So this month, let us all try and make an effort to take our jitters – big or small, light or heavy, insignificant as they may seem – and place them in the Sacred Heart of our Savior who wants nothing more than to give us the peace we so desperately desire.

There is a blurb in our bulletin by the open Adoration hours that has been included for so long many of us might overlook it: *Jesus is calling you. Are you listening?* He is waiting at Mass, in the tabernacle, in the monstrance in the Adoration Chapel, and in our daily lives for us to take our fears, worries, and anxieties to Him. Let us not disappoint Him by turning away from His comforting presence when we are in distress.

Give Jesus your jitters. He is big enough to handle them!


