
## **July Events & Announcements**

#### July: The Seven Joys of Mary - The Resurrection - Reflection by Monique Sammut



A few years ago, I was working a 6 am to 3 pm shift at a 24 hour company. This shift was never easy, but one particular morning I was especially tired, cranky, and not in the mood for anything. I walked into the office, set my backpack on my desk, and started hunting for my coffee. The lady in the cubicle next to mine turned to me and said, "Monique, today is the first day of the rest of your life," and then she turned and went back to work. Immediately it hit me that I might be in the worst mood at the moment, but I had a choice about how the rest of my day would go. Thinking about that helped me refocus and be positive and productive instead of irritable and exhausted.

I share this story because while thinking about the Resurrection, I came across this quote: "Because of Easter, you can be assured of His forgiveness. Because of Easter, you can walk in His grace. Because of Easter, you can enjoy His freedom. Because of Easter, you can rest in His comfort. Because of Easter, you can be

empowered by His Spirit. Today is the first day of the rest of your life. Go live it" (Melissa Maimone). How many of us celebrate Easter and then go about our lives as if the Resurrection changed nothing? Dietrich Bonhoeffer said, "To live in the light of the Resurrection – that is what Easter means." Do we live in the light of the Resurrection? Do we remember that we have a Redeemer who died and rose for us so that we could live in freedom? Do we live each day in this freedom, or are we still walking in darkness?

In "Hope's Song," Rebecca Saint James sings, "For He died for us to give us life, and to give us hope He rose." And Pope Benedict XVI said, "The one who has hope lives differently; the one who hopes has been granted the gift of a new life." Let us embrace this new life that the hope of the Resurrection gives us. If the joy of Easter faded with the spring, let us renew that today. Let us embrace every day as a new opportunity for gratitude, praise, and beginning again. "Today is the first day of the rest of your life. Go make it a good one" (Charles Dederich).
